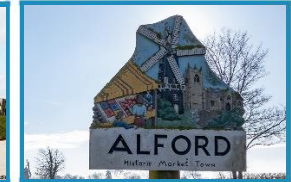

Befriending & Mentoring Roles

Use your life experience to make a difference to others

Lincoln and Lindsey Blind Society A Friend in Sight – Telephone Befriender – East Lindsey

Could you help to support a visually impaired/severely sight impaired person with advice and companionship over phone. We urgently need people to provide this type of befriending. Full training and support will be given.



BRIC – Building Resilience in Communities: Family Support Mentor

Do you want to be able to support families through the issues they are facing? Your call or video chat could make a huge difference to someone's life. By providing a non-judgemental, empathetic listening ear you will be a lifeline to reducing isolation, talking through the issues we all face in family life and supporting families to move forward creating healthier, happier and resilient families.

Healthwatch Lincolnshire: Health & Care Community Listener – Giving Patients, Carers & Service Users 'A Voice'

Do you like to get out and about, visiting new places and meeting new people? Do you have interest in what is happening with our local Health and Social Care services? Engagement activities take place in local communities, either in health or care settings or other public places. The role involves talking to the public, listening to what they have to say and at times helping them to record their experiences.

Adults Supporting Adults (ASA): Shop 2 Gether – East Lindsey

We are looking for sociable, friendly volunteers who can spare a few hours a week to help vulnerable people access the shops; allowing them to do their shopping, maybe have a cup of coffee whilst they are out, and then safely returning them home to unpack (helping them to do this also if the person requires).

Carers First: Telephone Befriender – East Lindsey

We are recruiting Telephone Befrienders across all of Lincolnshire to provide a listening ear for those who care for family/friends to attend and complete the training required by Carers First prior to initial contact with Carers. To provide telephone contact to those who care and offer reassurance along with the opportunity for someone to have a chat with a friendly person. 1-2 hours per week (Though these can be flexible hours by agreement of the Community Inclusion Coordinator).
