Lincoln and Lindsey Blind Society

Client Befriender (Friend In Sight Project) – Skegness

To provide one on one companionship and support to a visually impaired person who is isolated or lonely.

A Friend In Sight Telephone Befriender – East Lindsey

Could you help to support a visually impaired/severely
